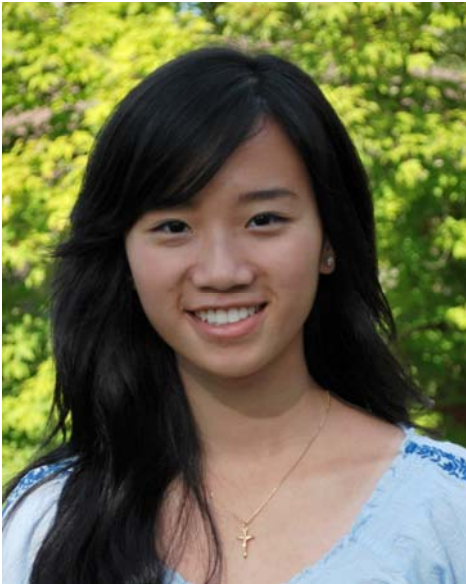
The students and their parents are honored guests at a regular Rotary luncheon.
